Tom Hurley, Mellifontstown

INVITATION TO THOSE WHO ARE SUFFERING

Most of us will do anything we can to avoid pain, suffering or even a little discomfort. Yet Christ teaches that suffering is not pointless, that it can be redemptive, it can be offered to God as a sacrifice for the sake of others. Even if suffering is not inherently good, it can produce good if we endure it, allow it to purify us and make it into a sacrifice. God is not deaf. When we offer our suffering for the good of others, it is extraordinary what can happen.

Jesus says “*Whoever wishes to come after me must deny himself, take up his cross and follow me*” (Mt.16.24). Everyone struggles with suffering from time to time. It could be physical pain from some illness, it could be the suffering of a family member or friend, it could be a parent suffering because of a child. Whatever the case we can offer up our suffering on their behalf.

I would like to invite all who are suffering at the moment if you would offer your suffering as a sacrifice for the good of our parish, that the faith of the people may be enlivened and passed on to the next generation.

Jesus says we must not flee from our crosses. Just as He accepted the Cross, he offered all for the sake of the world, so we can channel our pain and suffering for the good of others.

What does it mean in practice? Each time you face a difficult situation at home or in your personal life, pray “Lord, I offer this for the sake of my parish community”. To be clear, this is not an attempt to manipulate God. We can't force God's hand. In God's spiritual economy He always meets sacrifice with grace which is God's goodness working in the world.

Should you know anyone who is carrying a heavy cross you might extend this invitation to them.
