Fr. Robert writes...

ST. TERESA OF CALCUTTA

Born 26.8.1910 Died 5.9.1997 Canonised 4.9.2016

Last Sunday in Rome, Pope Francis formally added St. Teresa to the list of canonised Saints of our Church. She was born Agnes Bojaxhiu, of Albanian parents, in the city of Skopje, present day Macedonia. Saints are presented to us for our devotion for two reasons: we can be inspired by their exemplary lives and because of their goodness; we believe they are now in Heaven with God, they can pray and intercede for us.

At 18 years of age, Agnes Bojaxhiu joined the Loreto Sisters and took the name Teresa. She came to Dublin to learn English. Her ties with Ireland remained strong and she was given the Freedom of Dublin in 1993. After Dublin she went to teach in India. After 20 years working there she received 'a call within a call'. She felt the Lord was calling her to care for the poorest of the poor. She worked in the slums of Calcutta. She founded a religious order, 'Missionaries of Charity.' Her work flourished in orphanages, medical centres, a house for the dying and others.

While she was working in the slums of Calcutta, British journalist Malcolm Muggeridge followed her around with a cameraman and told her story to the world. She received the Nobel Prize in 1979. She became poor herself to serve the poorest of the poor. She said the greatest poverty of our time is to be unwanted. She saw this spiritual poverty most of all in the privileged nations of the world.

The Lord is saying something to us through the story of the life of St. Teresa of Calcutta, whose Feast Day from now on is September 5th each year. May we listen to the promptings of the Spirit. May St. Teresa of Calcutta pray for us.
