## PARISH FINANCE COMMITTEE UPDATE

The Parish Finance Committee met on **Tues 4<sup>th</sup> Oct** to discuss parish finances and maintenance. The committee discussed the issue of increased maintenance costs due to:

1. Continuous repairs to the church roof, windows and the parochial houses;
2. The installation and running costs of the parish webcam;
3. Ongoing grounds maintenance.

The committee feel that it is an appropriate time to encourage people to participate in the Offeratory Envelope Scheme as a means of increasing the weekly collection. Once a parishioner who is a taxpayer (either PAYE or self-employed) contributes €250 annually to the parish, the tax can be reclaimed from Revenue at no extra cost to the person donating. The parish benefits considerably. Last year we received €8,250 from the Revenue Commissioners. The Parish Finance Committee would like to thank all contributors to the weekly collection. ## PRACTICE: LIVING SIMPLY

We discover simplicity in the silence of contemplative prayer. As we let go of thought and sensation, we reconnect with our Centre, our source of abundance and enoughness. I invite you to consider ways beyond your contemplative practice in which you can live more simply. Quaker teacher Richard Foster suggests ten principles for expressing simplicity outwardly. Here's his list in my words:

1. Buy things for their usefulness rather than their status or prestige.
2. Learn the difference between a real need and an addiction. Then find support and accountability to regain "sobriety," freedom from addiction.
3. Develop a habit of giving things away.
4. Avoid unnecessary and short-lived technological gadgets that promise to "save time".
5. Enjoy things without owning them. For example, take advantage of public libraries and parks.
6. Nurture awe & appreciation for nature. Spend more time outdoors!
7. Get out – and stay out – of debt.
8. Use plain, honest speech. Say what you mean and keep your commitments.
9. Reject anything that oppresses others. For example, buy Fair Trade products.
10. Seek God's kingdom of love and justice foremost. If anything distracts you from that purpose, let it go.
