NOVEMBER

The Value of Remembering our Dead

November is the time of year when we remember our dead: visiting the graveyard where our loved ones are buried, or the place their ashes are scattered; writing their names on the Altar List of the Dead; praying for them at the Novena of Masses and reflecting on the story of their lives. We call this the 'Communion of Saints', the ninth article of faith in the Apostles Creed. A spiritual union exists among the saints in heaven, the holy souls in purgatory and the people of God living on earth. The Second Vatican Council described our loved ones who have died as 'our outstanding benefactors'. They can pray for us and inspire us.

On Sunday 1st November we celebrate 'All Saints' Day'. It is the feast of all the holy women and men of every time and place, praising God in heaven. On Monday 2nd November we celebrate 'All Souls' Day'. We remember all the faithful departed.

Remembering our dead these days reminds me that we usually only see death from one side, pain, loss, tears, grief, a difficult and sad time. Yet there is another side which tells us that death is a friend that takes us to the 'Father's house' where all 'tears are wiped away'. The darkness of death is no more. Remembering our dead and reflecting on the story of their lives can help us look at our values and what really matters at the end. Jesus, our teacher, tells us what is most important of all, what is life giving. His teaching of the Beatitudes, this Sunday's Gospel, is what will help us make it to the other world.
