Fr. Robert writes....

FRESH BREAD



Bread supplies a lot of the nutrients that the human body needs for growth, maintaining good health and well-being. It is a good source of proteins, vitamins, minerals, fibre and carbohydrates. Bread takes time to digest and is therefore more satisfying and gives us more energy for a longer period in comparison to other foods. We need daily bread.

Jesus chose to be present to His followers by giving us the Mass when we gather as His people. He gives us *‘the Bread of Life’* (John 6). But Jesus also said that, *‘not by bread alone do we live but by every word that comes from the mouth of God’* (Mt. 4.4 Dueteronomy 8.3). Jesus, who is the Son of God, invites us to share in His life. *‘Come to me all you who labour and are overburdened, I will give you rest. Shoulder my yoke and learn from me. I am gentle and humble in heart and you will find rest for your souls. My yoke is easy and my burden light.’* (Mt 11.28-30)

Like all living things, knowledge dies when it stops growing. We survive best as individuals and as groups when we continue to learn. It is exciting to learn new things about ourselves, about our world, about our God. Continuing to learn is important, not only in school but right through life.

Our Parish Mission, which begins on Saturday 21st May, is an opportunity for learning more about our God. May it be a positive spiritual experience of God’s mercy, forgiveness and healing in the Sacraments He has given to us in our Faith Community.

I warmly welcome Sr. Briege and Fr. Kevin and all who come to the Mission. May the experience be like having fresh nourishing bread, *‘the bread which is full of all goodness’*.

By making time for the Lord, may we be strengthened by Him. *‘Those who know their strength from God are strong indeed.’* (Psalm 62)

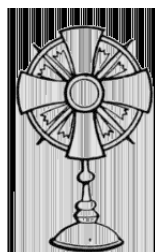

CORPUS CHRISTI PROCESSION

Our annual Corpus Christi Procession will take place next Sunday (29th May) after 12.00 Mass. The procession will take the following route:

ROUTE OF THE PROCESSION

- From the Church gate to Guardwell
- On to Main Street
- Left at Bank of Ireland
- Left into Short Quay for Benediction
- Exit Short Quay onto Barry's Place
- Left on to Pearse Street
- Left on to Market Street
- Right at Museum towards Assumption Terrace
- Right on to Cork Street and back to the Church for Benediction



ORDER OF THE PROCESSION

An **Altar Server with Cross** will lead the Procession at the junction of Friar's Street and Cork Street.

The **First Communicants** will gather behind the Altar Server with Cross.

The remaining **Altar Servers** will gather behind the Communicants and in front of the Canopy.

The **Canopy for the Blessed Sacrament** will be outside the main gate.

The **Choirs** will gather behind the Blessed Sacrament.

Followed by the **Congregation.**

On leaving the church the congregation will be reminded to exit by the upper gates to form the procession.

ADORATION

There will be continuous Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament until Benediction on Monday evening at 7.00pm. **NOTE:** There is NO Adoration on Tuesday 31st May. **A time-table will placed at the back of the church for people to enter their names so that there will be people present at all times during adoration.**

- Holy Hour including Evening Prayer on Sunday at 7.00pm.
- Benediction on Monday evening at 7.00pm.
