## GOD'S LOVE

There is a morning prayer that someone gave me a few years ago that I use and like and find helpful. Part of the prayer says:

*"Lord, I thank you for this new day. I know the most important reality of my life is that you love me and that you look at me this moment with such tenderness and love as no one ever could..."*

I believe in God's love for each one of us but sometimes I wonder do I really believe that it is the most important reality of my life? There are so many other things that I give importance to in my life. There are so many other things that take my attention. I struggle to keep the focus of God's love in theory and in practice. Yet it is so life giving. Pope Francis gave an interesting insight into love of God when he recently said:

*"When you want to control your abandonment in the hands of God, the tenderness of your filial relationship is lost. Neither ideology nor psychoanalysis or sociological interpretation of the mystery knows of tenderness. Rather, they are the art of manipulating, not of caress".*

This Sunday's Gospel gives the summary that Jesus gave of the message of scripture *"Love God, love your neighbour as yourself"*. St. John tells us God loved us first. Open our hearts, Lord, to accept the words of your Son because they are truly life giving.
